Successful Culmination of 32nd IISSM Annual Global Conclave

The IISSM's Annual Global Conclave, the 32nd, was organised on **18-19 Nov 2022**. This year too, the Conclave was to be held on the virtual platform, but improved conditions of Covid-19 motivated us to organise in the Physical mode too. Thus the decision was taken to hold it on a hybrid mode so that larger audience can get the benefits specially who could not travel to Delhi on those days. The venue for the Physical conduct was Hotel Crowne Plaza, Okhla, Phase 1, New Delhi, India.

The over arching theme for the conclave is "Security, Safety and Loss Prevention : Enablers to the Nation Building". There were four Keynote addresses and four Panel discussions each.

The Inauguration Ceremony commenced with the National Anthem and the traditional lighting of the lamp. Mr. S K Sharma extended a hearty welcome to all the guests, speakers, delegates, and other dignitaries for attending the Conclave. He appreciated the efforts of the team IIASM for Inviting the best of minds across the globe and expressed his best wishes for the grand success of the deliberations which were to be conducted over the next two days.

Thereafter, Mr. R K Sinha gave an insight into the genesis leading to the establishment of IISSM. He enumerated the role of IISSM and thanked the Late Mr. K N Prasad, Padma Shri for his guidance in establishing IISSM and seeing it through its primitive years. He highlighted the following aspects:-

a)The need to promote growth, in as much as to understand the problem and thereafter, find workable solutions

b)IISSM in its last 32 years has trained thousands of professionals and continues to do so to enable professionals benefiting from these Training Programmes to enable them to carry out their job in a better way.

Mr. Rajan Medhekar, IPS (Retd.), former DG, NSG and currently the DG, IISSM proposed a Vote of Thanks, thanking Mr. R K Sinha for sparing his valuable time despite a very heavy official schedule to inaugurate IISSM's 32nd Annual Global Conclave 2022 at the Crowne Plaza and on the Virtual Platform. He also thanked all the dignitaries and delegates for their support.

This was followed by the Keynote Address by Mr. PM Heblikar, Director, Maxgrid Securicor (India) Limited and former Special Secretary, Government of India on the topic "Role of Security, Safety and Loss Prevention in Nation Building". He highlighted the need for viewing security at a macro level and not through a narrow prism. In addition, the new normal as an outcome of the Corona Virus Pandemic 2019 and the recent Russian-Ukraine war affecting global security. The Second Keynote address was delivered by Mr. D C Pathak (IPS), (Retd); Former Director, Intelligence Bureau on – "Understanding Security, Safety and Loss Prevention" at 4 pm. He highlighted that technology should be taken as a force multiplier, since, information needs to be protected. He mentioned that approximately two-thirds of information breaches were due to the involvement of insiders.

This was followed by a Panel discussion on "Role of Security, Safety and Loss Prevention in National Growth", Moderated by Mr. Shankar Subramnian with 4 eminent Panelists. The Panel Member highlighted that security and safety must lie at the heart of a Nation to ensure prosperity. There was a need for involving the citizens in more activities for supporting the Government and other agencies in ensuring a safe and secure ecosystem.

The Panelists highlighted how digital transformation had changed the concept of security, wherein, the Army does not have to physically invade countries, thereby, shifting the battlefields down to mobile phones and the virtual arena. It was necessary to analyze and continually review the aspects of technology being used is safe. This marked the end of proceeding for Day One.

DAY 2

The IISSM Annual Global Conclave, second day, 19th November 2022 commenced with the keynote address by Mr. Jason L Brown, National Director, Thales, Australia & New Zealand. It was conducted online with live streaming at the Crowne Plaza, Okhla, the physical conduct venue of the conclave. Mr. Jason L Brown highlighted the strategy that needed to be developed, keeping in mind the relationship that a country is maintaining with the world. In addition, he highlighted the threats that have existed or can come to the fore in the future and the impacts that this would have on the businesses and the business environment.

The keynote address was followed by the fourth Panel, which discussed "Management of Security, Safety and Loss Prevention in Smart Cities; Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats", moderated by Col Sumit Monga, Lenovo. The Panelists highlighted that the culture of working in silos needs to be shed and stressed the need for integration of all the systems and

(From the IISSM Alumni) Security and Loss Prevention in Steel Industry: An Enabler to Nation Building

Introduction

open-source information. 1 As per historically India had been the using Steel from long time and in modern days production of Steel in India goes back to 1800BC. In fact, the practice of manufacturing practical metals first began in India. Archaeological sites in India, such as Malhar, Dadupur, Raja Nala Ka Tila, and Lahuradewa in the state of Northern India show iron implements in the period between 1800 BCE-1200 BCE. Whereas in modern era, steelmaking in India began with the setting of the first blast furnace of India at Kulti in 1870 and production began in 1874, which was set up by Bengal Iron Works. While first modern steel manufacturing plant was set up at the Gun & Shell Factory (GSF), in 1901, and along with the Metal & Steel Factory (MSF), at Calcutta. Actually, these developments were all due to establishment of Coal Mining in India way back in late 18th century which eliminated the need for approximately 14.5 ton of charcoal to be created to smelt each ton of iron, and offering a source of power for the trains and riverboats used to carry the ores and smelted metals. The Tata Iron and Steel Company (TISCO) was established by Dorabji Tata in 1907, as part of his father's conglomerate. By 1939 it operated the largest steel plant in the British Empire and accounted for a significant proportion of the 2 million tons of pig iron and 1.13 of steel produced annually.

2. As of October 2021, India was the world's second-largest producer of crude steel. In FY22 (till January), the production of crude steel and finished steel stood at 98.39 MT and 92.82 MT, respectively. With the liberal policies of the government of India, further growth is expected and will continue to remain no 2 in the world of steel production. But all these successes can't be without any problem. Like any other industry, this industry also faces lot of challenges, security is one of them. In this paper, I shall discuss some salient aspects of

the security challenges faced by the Security teams in the operational steel plants.

Security and Loss Prevention

We all understand that Industrial 3. Security is used to protect industrial machines and plants against unauthorized access. sabotage, and malicious manipulation. Establishing of security measures at a particular location depends upon various dynamic factors. Manufacturing companies have a lot to consider when it comes to physical security. Not only do they have to think about protecting the people working in the facility and the products that they are producing but also their customer and employee information, financial records, product information/trade secrets, and much more. As manufacturing becomes increasingly connected and complex, it's vital that manufacturers adopt more modern security practices that go beyond a traditional perimeter security approach.

4. Before moving ahead, we must be aware about the critical areas of the steel plant, which are as follows: -

- a) Blast Furnace and other hot metal areas
- b) Route of train carrying Liquid Iron to finish product lines
- c) Raw material handling area
- d) Sinter and the feeder route
- e) Power plant
- f) Coke Oven and Coal store
- g) Finished product mills
- h) Secondary product lines
- i) Oxygen Plant
- j) Electric sub stations
- Warehouses of different types (Raw material, Finished Products and Secondary sales etc)

5. Following are the challenges which are being faced by the security team in a steel plant on daily basis: -

a) **Theft Cases.** Since all the raw material and Iron has value, theft cases increase exponentially. Nearby local villagers take advantage of porous boundary and will tieup with insiders, always are on look out to pick up anything which they think will fetch some money. Normally, local thieves are always on look out for anything related with copper.

b) **Material movement.** In a medium sized plant, on an average, there is a movement of 1000 heavy vehicles, few carrying raw material and few with finished products.

c) **Truck Drivers.** maximum of them are gentle and busy in their tasks but a lot of them resort to stealing of products by making changes in the structure of the trailer or body.

d) **TAT timing.** A huge responsibility lies for security to reduce the TAT timing of the trucks.

e) **Traffic Management.** As the task and commitment is increasing day by day, there is always a pressure to increase the flow of traffic and with restriction of 16Kmph, it becomes very hectic and it consumes more manpower for the management traffic inside the plant, which is heavily dependent on loading and offloading capacity of the plant.

f) **BP Management.** Despite having big companies to provide manpower for security duties, BP end up in providing what is available in the market at cheapest rate rather than well trained guards due to budget constraints.

g) Access Control and Visitor access system. All these systems must be user friendly rather than meeting the needs. Security teams faces a lot of challenges especially when there is a network break down due to various reasons.

h) **Coordination with CSR and PR Team.** To handle the security at various functions undertaken by CSR team, there is need of dedicated team, which provide security as well as security to Executives during these events.

i) **Local Unrest.** Almost everyday there will be situations of road blockage and agitation for the needs of various demands.

Local politicians play the role of igniters and make these small agitations as big law and order situations. To ensure business continuity, security team always remains in line of fire.

j) **Incident Management.** Incase of mishap, taking the injured to nearby hospital or to the designated hospital remains with security.

6. To handle all these events along with training of all personnel, CSO or Head Security must ensure that he has a team which has expertise in all areas. Following the experts, a CSO must have in his team: -

a) Accounts Expert (For processing of various invoices, wage sheets and other

accounts related tasks).

b) Vigilance Expert (He must be a local person, having understanding of area, local politician and villagers).

c) IT expert must be there is ensure the physical protection of IT assets and must be able to advise as per threat perception

d) Must have a team of ESMs to handle any event or incident in a professional way.

Conclusion

7. Demand of Steel is increasing day by day and all plants are expanding to meet the vision of Government of India of 300MT production to become world leader. A thorough preparation is needed in advance by security professionals to meet all security challenges with the help of proper dovetailing of technology and guards.
