
Certified Security Practitioners' Course (VC) 6-7 & 13-14 February 2021




CSP (VC) : CLASS IN PROGRESS

Greetings to you all!

We started this year with a positive note that Covid-19 was on the wane, at least in India but that advantage seems to have been lost as we are seeing a gradual rise in numbers again. But that does not mean, that the situation has become critical. Unfortunately, we became too complacent about it and if it goes unchecked, days will not be far when we see a repeat of 2020. While in India, Covid-19 was gradually receding but elsewhere in the world in European nations specially UK, France, Germany, Spain etc, USA and some of the Latam countries like Brazil, Mexico, Chile, Peru the situation has not been very happy. They have been facing the pandemic as never before. Death Rate per million populations in these countries are very high, if compared to India, Belgium's figure stands at 1872, UK-1746 and USA -1513, wherein India's DRM is -113 till now, is something unbelievable.

In the month of June –July 2020, the world media was forecasting that it will be 'Doomsday' for India and everybody was of the opinion that it will be disastrous. This may be the fall out of the rising temperature of the globe, negative fallout of climate change. We at the IISSM have been raising this concern and spreading awareness amongst the students, professionals and all stake holders during our courses, Seminars and International Conclaves.
