29th Annual Global Conclave of IISSM: Setting a New Benchmark for the Security Industry

29th Annual Global Conclave of International Institute of Security and Safety Management (IISSM), which is a much awaited and most sought after event of the Security and Safety Industry for this year was held at Hotel Conrad, Bengaluru on 14-15 Nov 2019. As Bengaluru is the IT capital of India and a major hub of IT business in the world, the central theme for the Conclave chosen was "New Paradigms for Loss Prevention in the Digital Era".

The conclave was inaugurated by Mr. Bhaskar Rao, IPS, Commissioner of Police, Bengaluru. Before that the Chief Guest was extended a hearty welcome by Sri SK Sharma, IPS (Retd) and the Chairman, IISSM. The auditorium was fully subscribed with various stakeholders - Security and safety professionals from different parts of the country as well as foreign nationals. This was an unique opportunity wherein Security/Safety professionals of the leading com-

New Concepts and Future Technologies: In this Conclave, many relevant issues related to Security Business with AI, Blockchain, Machine Learning were being discussed to ensure security and safety in business places, Road Safety, Data Safety and





personal privacy as well as security. The discussions were intense and focussed to mitigate the immediate and near future challenges with the available and emerging technologies. But this Conclave can boast of the fact that some of new Concepts flowed out of the interactive sessions. Concepts like 'Humane Computing', 'Data Dumping', 'Data Archiving (in frozen conditions)', 'Data Retrieval' and 'Data Destruction' were elaborated upon and the delegates took keen interest in these futuristic technologies and innovations. In addition, it was heartening to see that there were ladies as moderator, panellists and delegates which is uncommon for the security industry. There were speakers from IAS,

IPS and ex military top brass as Keynote speakers. With this mix of top experts participating in discussions and deliberations, the level, content and deliberations were of very high order. Mr. RK Sinha, Hon'ble MP (Rajya Sabha) and Executive Chairman, IISSM who has been at the helm of affairs of IISSM since last three decades commented that this was one of the best Conclave in terms of quality, content and level of participation.
